HUD Lead Levels (Effective April 1, 2017)

New Lead Dust Hazard Action Levels:

Floors: ≥ 10 µg/ft2

Window Sills: ≥ 100 µg/ft2


New Lead Clearance Action Levels:

Interior Floors: < 10 μg/ft2

Porch Floors: $< 40 \mu g/ft2$

Window Sills: < 100 µg/ft2

Window Troughs: < 100 μg/ft2



*All Lead-Based Paint Hazard Control (LBPHC) and Lead Hazard Reduction (LHRD) Demonstration Grantees

HUD Lead Levels (Effective April 1, 2017)

Porch – No windows or screens. If it does then it is considered part of the interior floor.









EPA Lead Levels (Effective March 8, 2021)

New Dust-Lead Hazard Standards:

Floors: ≥ 10 µg/ft2

Window Sills: ≥ 100 µg/ft2

New Dust-Lead Clearance Levels:

Floors: ≥ 10 µg/ft2

Window Sills: ≥ 100 µg/ft2



MDH Lead Levels (Notice of intent to adopt)

4761.2510

Standards for lead in dust:

Floors: ≥ 10 µg/ft2

Window Sills: ≥ 100 µg/ft2

New Clearance levels?

4761.2670 – Work is successfully completed

when the standards are not exceeded after the completion of clearance sampling.



Effective July 1, 2021

Changed the definition of asbestos-related work

The residential material exemptions were removed.








Boilers

Piping

Furnaces; and

Wall material have always been regulated



Why is this a concern?

May require two separate credentials

MN Asbestos Abatement Contractor



Federal Certified Renovation Firm



Why is this a concern?

MDH regulates the removal of these materials if:

- 1) The materials are greater than 1% asbestos;
- 2) Are rendered friable; and
- 3) Over 6 square feet, 10 linear feet or 1 cubic foot of material*

*residential regulated material amounts

Why is this a concern?

If it is regulated, then:

- 1) Licensed contractor
- 2) Certified individuals
- 3) Notification/Permit
- 4) Applicable work practices









Speaking of RRP

Federal RRP

Has been around for 12 years and requires:

- 1) Information distribution requirements
- 2) Work practice standards
- 3) Post renovation cleaning verification
- 4) Recordkeeping and reporting requirements
- 5) Firm certification
- 6) Individual certification and training

Published for Request for Comments

Now under review by MDH legal staff.

Other Minnesota Rules

Am I required to do an asbestos inspection?

MDH Does not have that requirement

MNOSHA and MPCA do have mandatory requirements for inspections

MR 5207.0035 – Demolition, Restoration, Remodeling Asbestos Survey

40 CFR 61.145 – Applicability, prior to the commencement of the

demolition or renovation, a thorough inspection must occur

Other Minnesota Rules

Am I required to do an inspection?

MDH does have the following requirements if an inspection is done:

- 1) Certified Asbestos Inspector
- 2) Proper sampling protocol
- 3) Analysis by an accredited laboratory
- 4) Report requirements
