# Our Mission: The Core Purpose

housing that is affordable.



Publicly Owned Housing Program

## Publicly Owned Housing Program (POHP)

- First established by the Minnesota Legislature in 2005
- POHP has evolved since 2005 and has looked similar since the 2012 RFP
- Offer financial assistance to **Rehabilitate** and **Preserve** Public Housing Units
- Scope of work specifically addresses:
  - health and life safety
  - critical needs
  - energy and water efficiency / climate resiliency and sustainability
  - accessibility

# Funding Round Since 2012...

## Since 2012

- Seven rounds of funding (including this one)
- Awarded over \$150M for 163 rehabilitation projects\*

*\* Note some developments received multiple awards over time*

# Two Most Recent Funding Rounds

## Minnesota Housing GO BIG Funding Rounds in 2024 & 2025

Awarded over \$92M for 50 rehabilitation projects

# Most Recent Funding Round

## 🌊 2025 Round Only 🌊

- Awarded over \$53M for 32 projects
- Largest POHP round we have ever funded!
- How did that happen?

During our review and selection process, 2025 Legislature approved \$26M in GO Bonds for POHP.

We were able to allocate both 2024 Appropriations and 2025 GO Bond funds!

- Welcome: 5 HRAs are new to POHP!

# Comparison

	Appropriations	GO Bonds
Department of Administration Predesign required	No	Yes
Buildings, Benchmarks, & Beyond (B3) required	No	Yes
Compliance Term	20 years	35 years
Projects that have undergone Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) or similar conversion resulting in private ownership	Eligible	Not eligible
Tribal Entities	Eligible	Not eligible

## All loans, regardless of funding source

- 20-year
- 0% interest
- deferred, forgivable loan

# Who is going to help me?

During each phase, certain agency staff will be assigned to your project.  
Once assigned, the same person will work with you throughout the entire project.



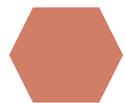
Underwriting      Underwriter and Agency Architect



Closing      Closer and Underwriter



Construction      Loan Processor, Underwriter and Agency Architect



Post-Construction      Draw Technician, Loan Processor, Underwriter and Agency Architect

# How long does each phase take?

Timing for each phase varies upon multiple factors, especially:

- the type of work
- what is found during the rehabilitation process.

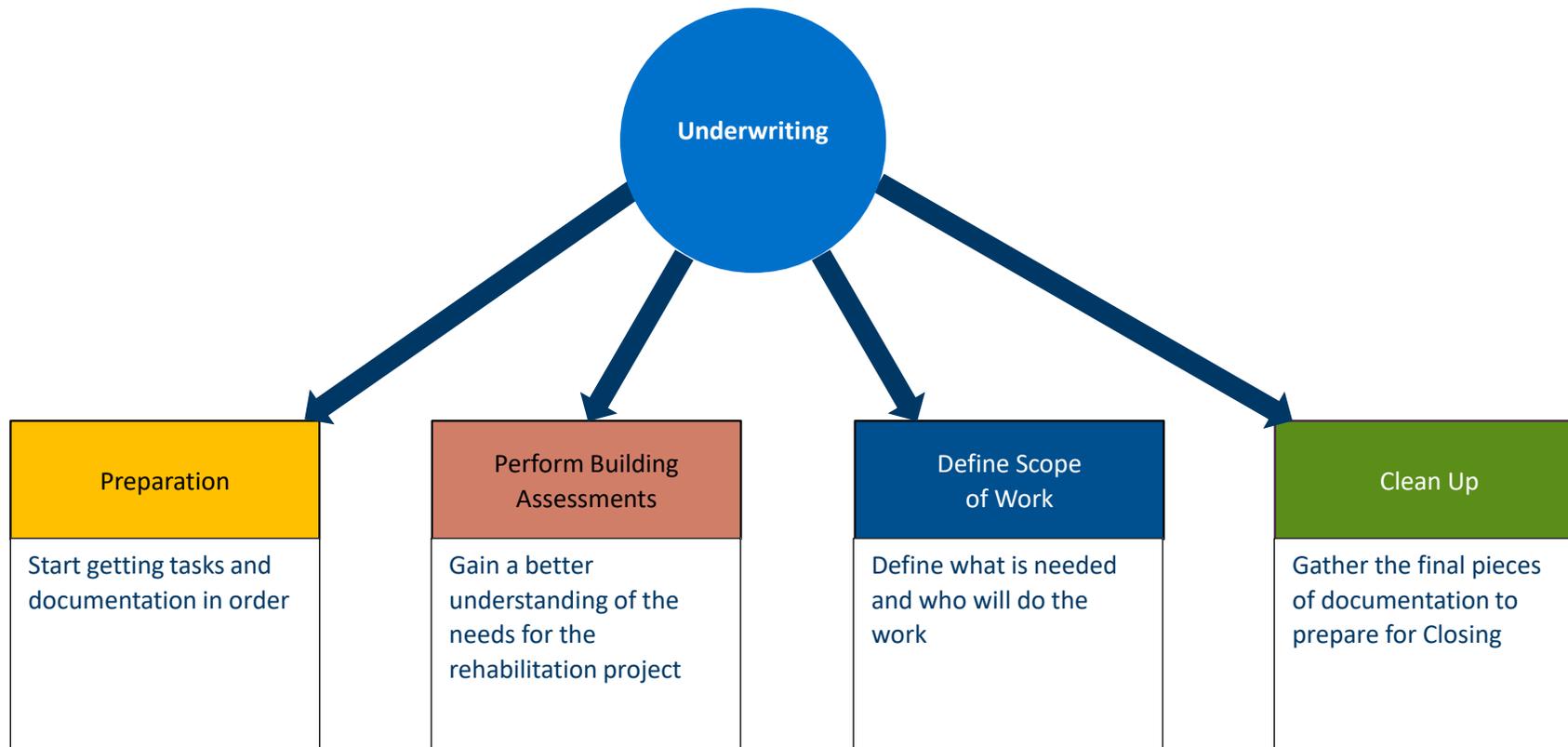
Here is a visual indicating how long each phase could be in relation to other phases.



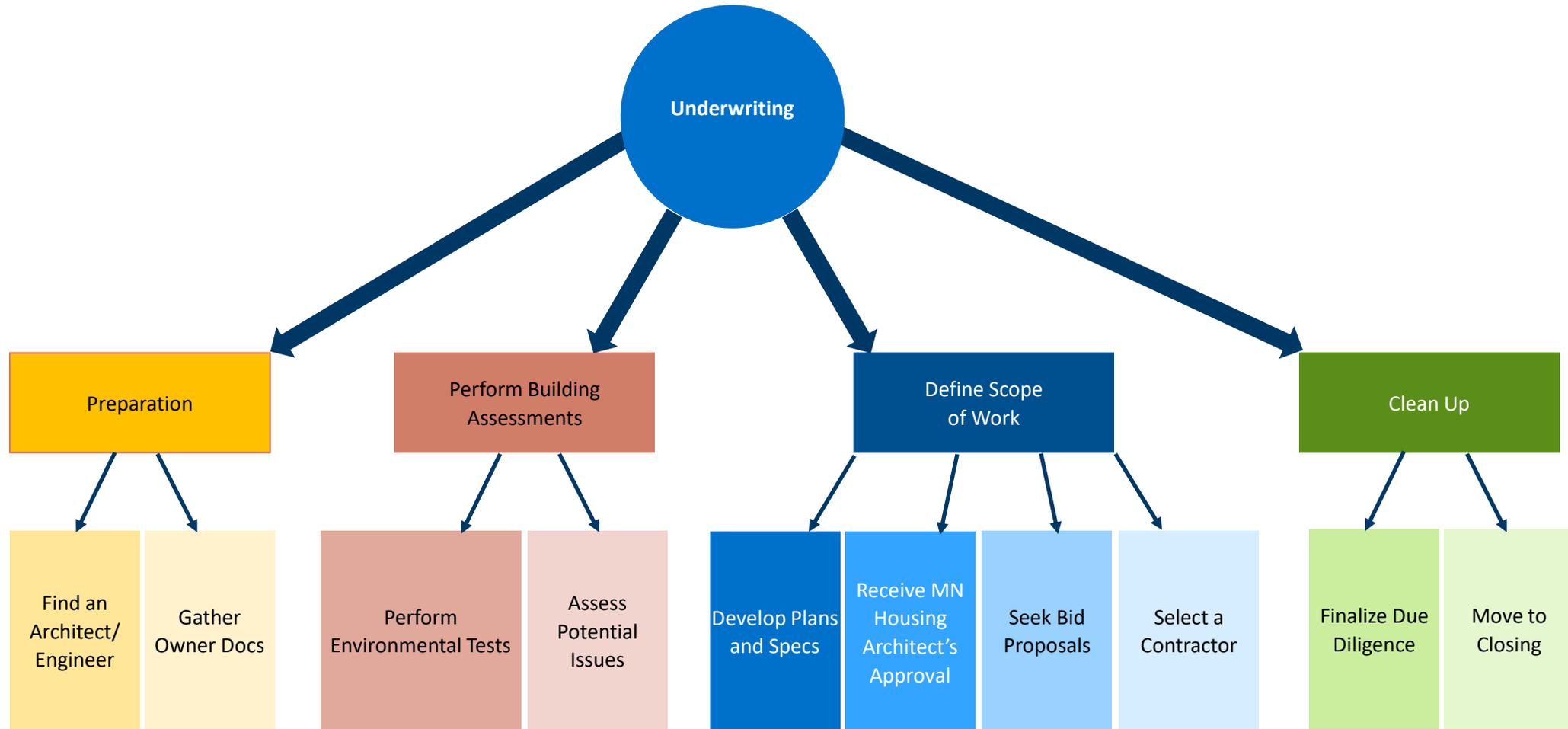

# Due Diligence - Preparation

Find an  
Architect/  
Engineer

- Owner / Architect Agreement (AIA form)
- Architect's Evidence of Insurance

Gather  
Owner Docs

- Authority's Enabling Resolution
- Authority's Bylaws (and any amendments)
- HUD Declaration of Trust
- Owner's Evidence of Insurance
  - General Liability is required
  - Property / Builder's Risk is required if not provided by Contractor
- SWIFT Vendor ID

# Due Diligence – Perform Building Assessments

Perform  
Environmental  
Tests

- Environmental Testing
  - Asbestos
  - Radon
  - Lead-based Paint (buildings built before 1978)
- B3 or Limited Scope Sustainability Form\*

Assess Potential Issues

\* - *B3 is not required for Appropriations funding*

# Due Diligence – Define Scope of Work

Develop Plans  
and Specs

- Design – 75% - 90% Contract Documents

Receive MN Housing Architect's Approval

- Design – 100% Contract Documents

Seek Bid Proposals

# Due Diligence – Define Scope of Work

Select a Contractor

- Draft Construction Contract                      Execute contract when file moves to closing team
- Contractor’s Evidence of Insurance
  - General Liability is required
  - Builder’s Risk is required if not provided by Owner
- Sworn Construction Statement (a.k.a Schedule of Values, AIA G702/G703)
- Building Permits – draft copies
- Payment and Performance Bonds                      If construction contract >\$175,000
- Workforce and Equal Pay Declaration Form\*
- Wage Theft Prevention Verification

\* - *Workforce and Equal Pay is not required for Appropriations funding*

# Due Diligence – Clean Up

Finalize  
Due  
Diligence

- Architect's Opinion Letter
- Owners and Encumbrance Report – dated within 120 days of closing
- Authority's Certified Bylaws – dated within 90 days of closing
- Authority's Borrowing Resolution – dated within 90 days of closing
